U.S. Embassy Dhaka in Bangladesh hereby issues this Combined Synopsis and Solicitation for the procurement of Brand-New Office Furniture and Installation Services. This announcement constitutes only solicitation. The solicitation number is PR16184260. The resulting purchase order will be awarded using Simplified Acquisition Procedures in accordance with FAR Part 13. All responsible vendors are invited to submit a quotation.

NAICS code

The North American Industry Classification System (NAICS) code is 337211. Registration in the System for Award Management (SAM) for the local offerors is not mandatory for this award, but the offerors registered in the System for Award Management www.SAM.Gov are also encouraged to submit their offers. By submission of its offer, the offeror represents" NDAA Section 889 compliance. It means that vendors are attesting to compliance with the terms of FAR provision 52.240-90, which includes covered telecommunications equipment or services representations, when submitting an offer.

Evaluation Method

Lowest Priced Technically Acceptable (LPTA).

Brand-name or equivalent items will be accepted.

Offerors must demonstrate compliance with all specifications and installation requirements.

The Government intends to make award based on initial quotes but may conduct discussions if necessary.

Scope of Work

The contractor shall provide all labor, materials, equipment, transportation, supervision, incidental services required to manufacture, deliver, and install new modular office workstations for Procurement, Travel, FMC, and DTO General Work Areas.



All work must comply with the Embassy requirements

- The approved Embassy furniture layout plan
- Applicable OBO Design Standards, including 15 FAM 750–751 (Office and FF&E requirements)
- ANSI/BIFMA commercial office furniture standards
- GSA Workstation Cluster Specifications (FCNE 87-442F) for performance, flame spread, acoustics, leveling, and durability

Responsibilities include

- Review and strictly follow the Embassy-approved furniture layout plan during fabrication and installation.
- Conduct a site visit, if required, to verify field dimensions, existing conditions, utility locations, access requirements, and installation constraints.
- Notify the Embassy and OBO-designated representative of any discrepancies prior to fabrication.
- Prepare detailed shop drawings, fabrication drawings, and updated furniture layouts for Embassy/OBO approval.
- Fabricate, deliver, assemble, and install all workstations and wall partition per approved drawings and OBO design requirements.
- Remove all debris, packaging materials, and waste upon completion.
- Ensure no major FF&E alterations occur following installation for a period of **two years**, unless approved by OBO per **15 FAM 751**.

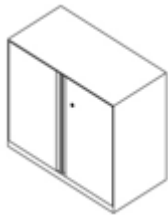

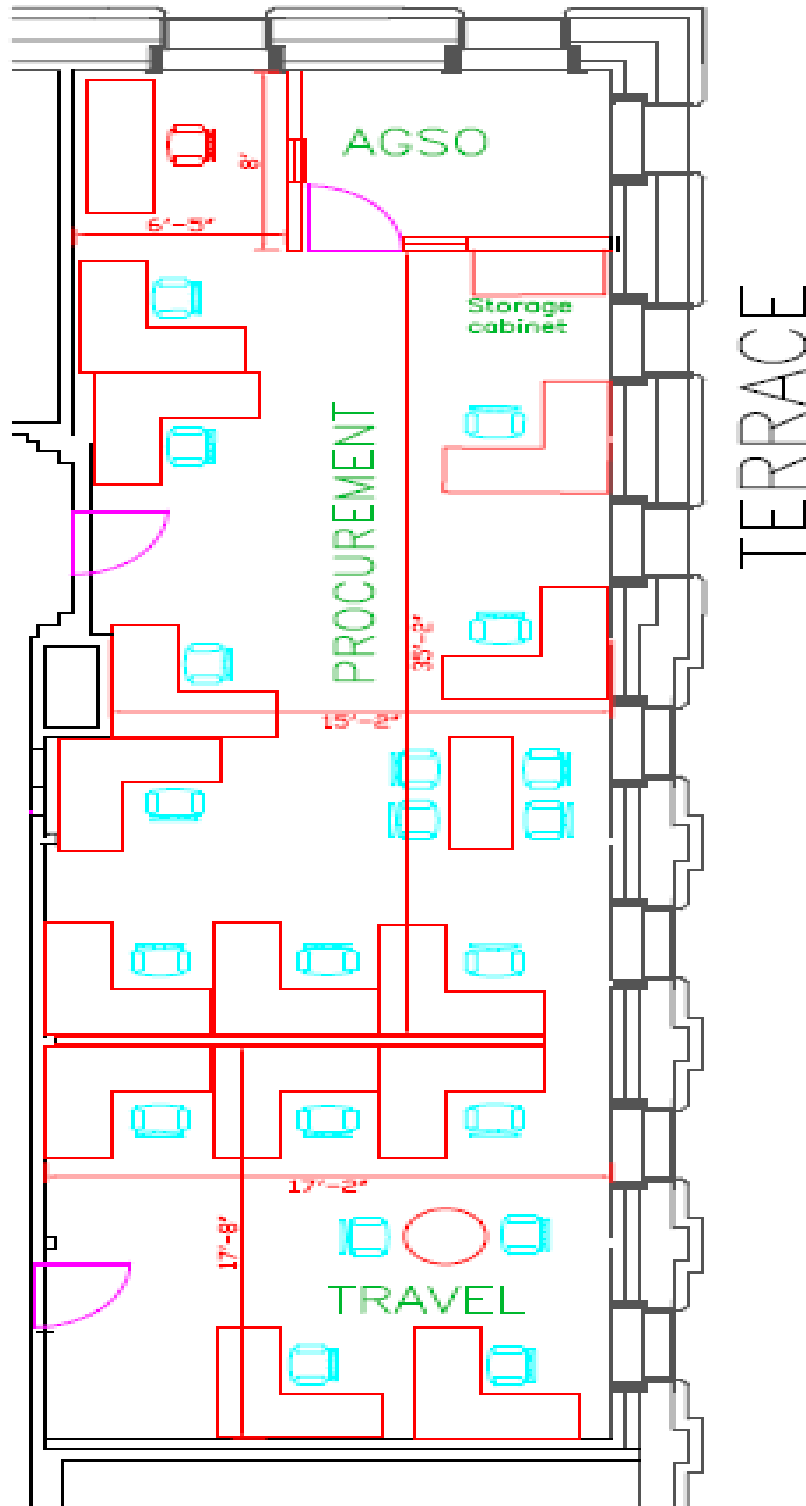

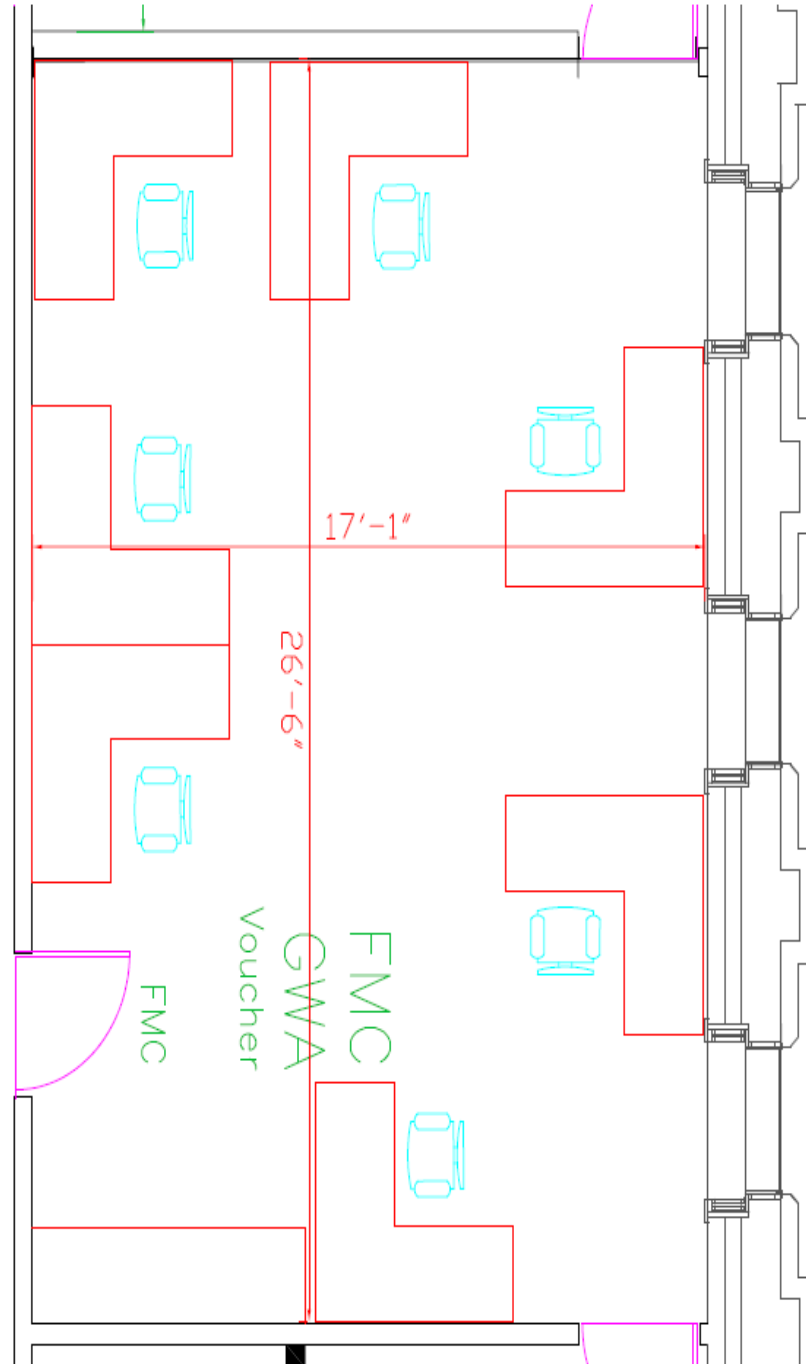


Travel & Procurement Furniture Layout



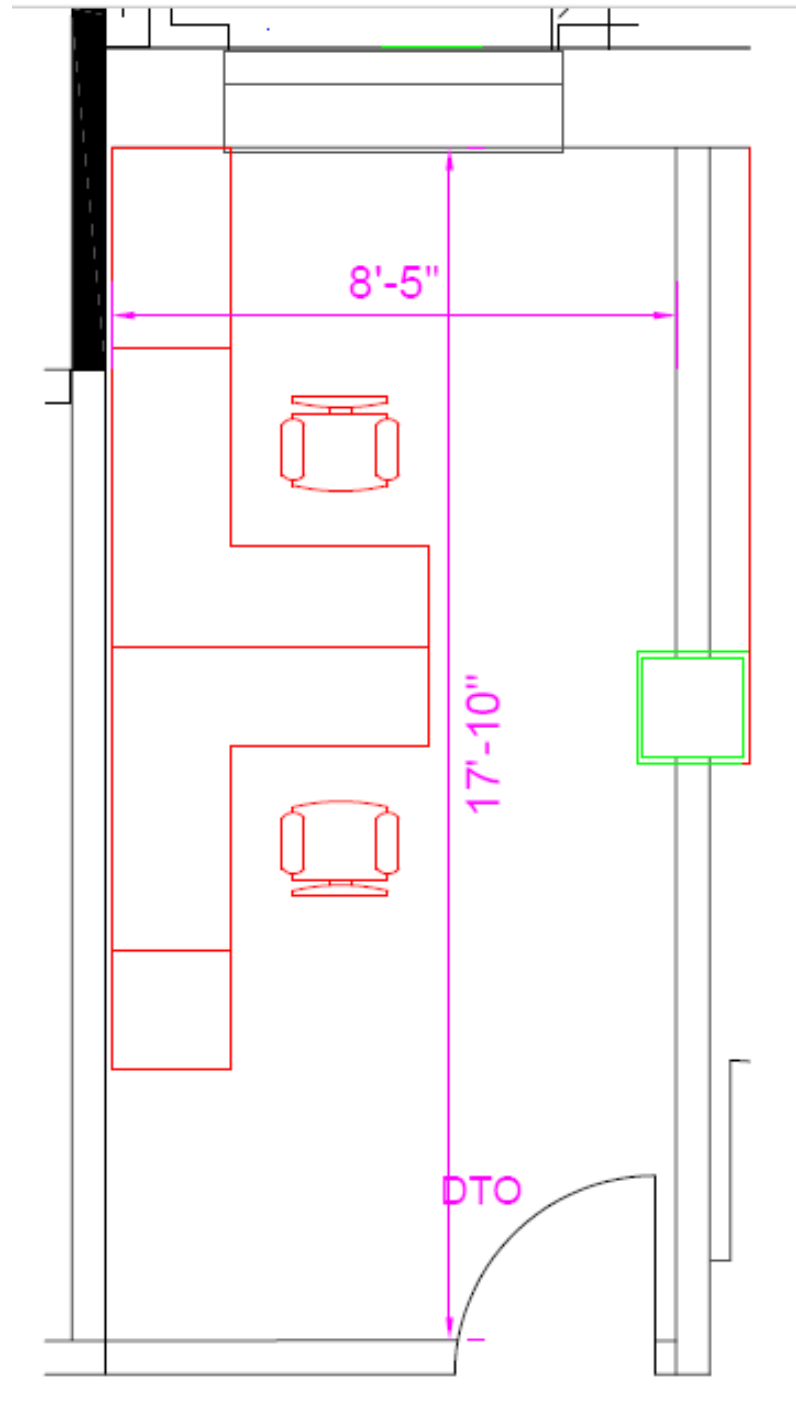


FMC GWA Furniture Layout

The Embassy anticipates awarding a **single firm fixed-price purchase order** as a result of this solicitation.

Technical Requirements

- L-shaped workstations (23 units), I-shaped workstation (1 unit), Workstation Drawer (24 unit), rectangular meeting table (1 unit), round meeting table (1 unit), Storage Cabinet (1 unit) (All items to be compatible with 220 Volt)
- Work surface dimensions:
 - L-shape: two surfaces at 5 ft × 5 ft × 2 ft
 - I-shape: one 6 ft × 2 ft surface

Height-Adjustable Desk Requirements

- Electrically motorized height adjustment.
- Height range approximately 700 mm – 1200 mm.
- Load capacity minimum 100 kg (uniform).
- Digital controller with **three programmable presets**.
- Safety: **Anti-collision protection** and overload/overcurrent protection.
- Noise rating ≤ 50 dB.
- Lifting speed ≥ 30 mm/sec.
- CE/UL or equivalent internationally recognized certification.
- Electrical input: 220–230 VAC, single-phase, 50 Hz.
- Power cable length ≥ 2.5 m.
- Must meet Embassy electrical and OBO Design Engineering requirements.
- **Storage Drawer Unit:** Each workstation shall be provided with one (1) under-desk mobile pedestal drawer unit. The drawer unit shall be installed beneath the primary work surface without interfering with the operation of the motorized height-adjustable mechanism.
- **Storage Cabinet:** overall size of the cabinet 4 ft × 2 ft (in procurement section)

Materials & Construction

All workstation components shall meet:

- **GSA FCNE 87-442F minimum requirements** for heavy-duty commercial use.



- **Flammability performance:** Panels and privacy screens shall be rated **Class A (0–25 flame spread)**, with maximum smoke development ≤ 450 .
- **Acoustical performance:** Privacy panels shall have **NRC ≥ 0.50** for sound attenuation.
- Engineered wood tabletops with high-pressure laminate (HPL), melamine-faced particle board, MDF with laminate, plywood/laminate, or approved solid wood.
- PVC edge banding on all exposed edges.
- Colors selected by Embassy from contractor's standard finishes.

Ergonomics

- Designs shall comply with ANSI/BIFMA ergonomic standards for office furniture.
- Work surfaces shall allow proper leg clearance, reach zones, and accessibility for computer equipment and task accessories.

Leveling & Alignment

- Leveling glides must provide **minimum 20 mm** vertical adjustment and meet GSA cluster tolerances.
- Maximum panel-to-floor clearance ≤ 25 mm when glides are fully retracted.
- Components must align precisely across all connected panels.

Material Options and Submittals

The contractor shall provide:

- Minimum three tabletop material options with durability, finish, maintenance, and service life data.
- Finish/color samples for Embassy review.
- Technical literature and product data sheets for all materials.
- Recommendations for durable and cost-effective solutions for institutional use.
- Fire and acoustical performance certifications for all panel systems.
- 3D design with images and estimated cost for the Office Workstation desk & partition

Accessories

Each workstation shall include:

- Integrated cable management tray.



- Cable grommets for power/data routing.
- Modesty panels where required.
- Adjustable leveling feet meeting GSA specs.
- Structural provisions for monitoring arms and CPU holders.
- Optional acoustic/privacy features meeting NRC and fire rating requirements.

Office Partition Wall

The contractor shall furnish, fabricate, deliver, and install one office partition wall to separate the Procurement and Travel Sections in accordance with the Embassy-approved furniture layout.

Partition Requirements

- Location: Between the Procurement and Travel Sections, as shown on the Embassy-approved furniture layout.
- Overall Length: 15 feet
- Overall Thickness: 4 inches
- Overall Height: 6 feet from finished floor level.
- The partition should be securely anchored to the floor and, where required, laterally braced to provide a rigid and stable structure.
- The finished partition should have smooth, aligned surfaces with concealed fasteners and a professional appearance suitable for a commercial office environment.

Construction

The partition shall consist of a heavy-duty galvanized or powder-coated steel frame with internal reinforcement and shall be finished using high-quality commercial-grade panels.

The contractor shall propose one of the following materials for Embassy approval:

- High-Pressure Laminate (HPL) finished MDF or plywood panels on both sides.
- Melamine-faced engineered wood panels with PVC edge banding.
- Moisture-resistant gypsum board fixed to a galvanized steel stud frame with a durable painted finish.



- Or alternative materials of equal or better quality may be proposed, provided complete technical specifications and product literature are submitted for Embassy review and approval.

Installation

The contractor shall:

- Assemble and install all furniture at designated locations.
- Test and verify operation of all motorized components.
- Coordinate installation activities to avoid disruption to Embassy operations.
- Ensure compliance with CAA installation security protocols, including inspections if applicable.
- Repair any damage caused during installation at no additional cost.
- Provide secure chain-of-custody documentation for CAA-destined items.

Quality Requirements

- All materials shall be new, defect-free, and commercial grade.
- Furniture shall be structurally sound for continuous, heavy-duty office use.
- Moving components must operate smoothly and quietly.
- Electrical components must meet CE/UL or equivalent safety certifications.
- Fire, acoustic, and ergonomic performance must meet the OBO/GSA standards stated above.

Deliverables

The contractor shall submit:

- Shop drawings, fabrication drawings, and final workstation layout.
- 3D design with images and estimated cost for the Office Workstation desk & partition
- Material samples and finish/color selections.
- Product catalogs, technical data sheets, and performance certifications.
- CE/UL electrical compliance documentation.
- CAA secure-procurement documentation (chain-of-custody, inspection records).
- Operation and maintenance manuals.
- Manufacturer's warranty certificates.
- On-site user demonstration and turnover training following installation.



Warranty Provisions (if any)

The contractor may provide the most favorable manufacturer's commercial warranty available for the offered item. A copy of the warranty in English may provide at no additional cost. Warranty rights are in addition to, and do not limit, Government rights under any other clause of the purchase order.

Requirements for a Responsive Offer

Offerors must submit:

1. A completed pricing table
2. Technical specifications, measurement with material details(s) including colors
3. 3D images of each item including floor plan with office furniture setup design
4. FAR 52.212-3 Offeror Representations and Certifications—Commercial Items

Failure to submit technical specs and 3D images (when applicable) will result in a **non-responsive offer** and removal from award consideration.

Technical specification sheet must clearly identify the model offered and must be received by the due date. Any submission that does not allow full technical evaluation may be rejected.

Quotation Submission Deadline

Offers are due on September 18, 2026 at 1630 hrs. Dhaka Time. All quotations/offers submitted before the RFQ closing date will be reviewed by the U.S. Embassy Dhaka.
